5. NRCS Report-John Wagoner:

NRCS offices are still open, but with a few modifications to how we are handling business. We are trying to navigate the transition to our new assessment and planning tools. CART/ Conservation Desktop. EQIP funds will be obligated in batches this year, with the first deadline being May 15. We are on track to have our TIP budget obligated into contracts by the first deadline. The S. T-roots conifer project should receive \$250K for funding. 7 applications are within Sage Grouse habitat, and eligible for funding through the statewide SGI conifer encroachment fund pool. With our current applications, we have 3150 acres planned and shovel ready for brush management and woody residue treatment. Estimated cost of \$410K. Actively working w/ Southwest MT Sagebrush partnership to coordinate cross-boundary treatments, and Gravelly Landscape collaborative to develop outreach and communication plan. CSP renewals will be obligated in July, we will only have 1 application. General CSP sign up will have an obligation deadline in the late summer/ fall. We have 1 application
